- Independent boarding (57%) and day school (43%) welcoming all genders
- Total number of Senior School students: 489
- Average class size: 14
- Boarding composition: 279 students from 28 countries including Canada
- Financial assistance: 22% of students receive financial aid based on need

Context

- Trinity College School provides a robust and challenging program that exceeds the requirements of the Ontario Ministry of Education.
- Both our boarding and day students are fully engaged in a busy and dynamic learning environment, typically 8:00 a.m. - 6:00 p.m. daily, often including evening and weekend commitments and opportunities.
- Habits like courage, creativity, compassion, integrity and perseverance are ingrained in our liberal arts curriculum and throughout our comprehensive co-curricular programs in athletics, arts and service learning.
- Given the emphasis on personal development, discovery and complete engagement, the School has developed academic policies to underscore the importance of a balanced education:
 - The School's Advanced Placement (AP) policy states that students **can take a maximum of 2 AP courses in Grade 11**. Students have a recommended **maximum of 4 AP courses in Grade 12**.
 - Grade 12 students take a maximum of 6 classes in their final year.
 - Many of our students complete a summer course.

Ontario Secondary School Diploma

Students graduating from Trinity College School earn the Ontario Secondary School Diploma (OSSD) and the Trinity College School Diploma. Only Ontario credits (not AP designations) appear on the Ontario School Transcript.

Grading System and Mark Distribution

Ontario universities require six 4U/4M credits to be considered for admission. All courses ending in U and M are university preparatory; U courses are considered to be at the honours level.

Grading at Trinity College School is on a 100 point scale (50% is a pass). Grading standards are mandated by the Ontario Ministry of Education.

We are a small, non-semestered school with high academic standards, expectations and support, therefore distinctions between students on the basis of their grades are not significant. Trinity College School does not rank students for university admissions purposes. Ranking differentials are so fine that it unfairly classifies a number of students of very similar calibre. Similarly, Trinity College School does not calculate GPA.

AP Capstone

Trinity College School was one of the first schools worldwide to offer the Advanced Placement (AP) Capstone Diploma™. This two-year program of study for Grade 11 and 12 students focuses on critical thinking, collaborative problem solving and research skills in a cross-curricular context.

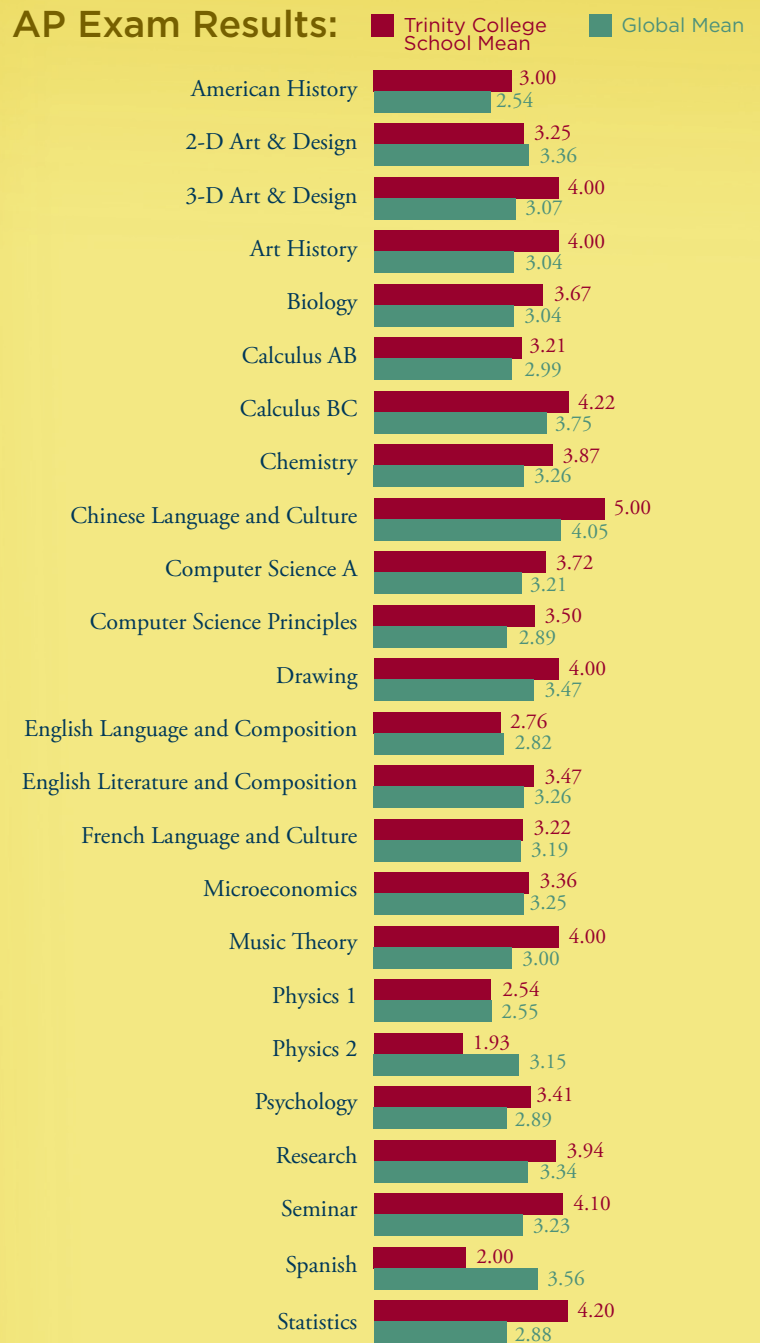

SAT preparation is not a part of Trinity College School programming. Students who elect to take the test do so off-site.



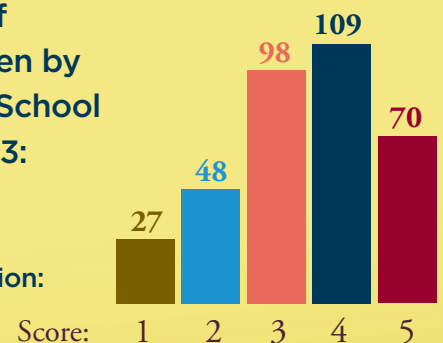
AP Exam Results:

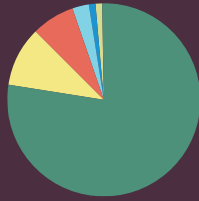
AP Score Distribution:
